## The Penn Ohio Racing Point System

This is our point system here at Penn Ohio Racing. We use this system for everybody, all tracks and all sanctioning bodies. We compare apples to apples here. All other preexisting point systems have issues. Nearly all are entirely too top heavy. Think of points as a percentage of reward to race teams for their support. Others count heat race points, why? I could see doing that if the heats are all handicapped with the faster cars starting in the back, but the feature is why we are here. Other point systems ignore non starters, why? Even if a car breaks while pulling off of the trailer, they are there at the track, supporting the speedways and groups, and deserve points for their support, as opposed to ones that aren't. But the other big problem is that nobody takes car count into consideration. They use the same system for classes with 2 cars to 200 cars. That's a problem that isn't going away. Our math based system based on car count fixes everything.

Step 1, count all cars that are in attendance in each division, whether they run the feature or not. If it is over 25, then use 25. Step 2, the feature winner earns the number from step 1, multiplied by 4. For example, 20 cars = 80 points. Step 3, second place gets two points less than the winner, with a one point drop per position for up to 75 percent of the field. All starters past that point receive the same amount of points. See the charts below for exact point counts. Step 4, any non starters receive 75 percent of what the winner earns.
